Walk-in Clinic Times Being added at Lapeer County Health Department

While those who prefer can still complete the on-line form for a scheduled appointment time, we are also adding some walk-in clinic times to our schedule.

Clinic Schedule at Health Department:

- Tuesday & Thursday – **BY APPT.** 10:00 – 6:00, but **also, Walk-ins welcome from 3:00 – 6:00**
- Wednesdays – **BY APPT.** 8:30 – 4:00; but **also, Walk-ins welcome from 12:00 – 4:00**

Testing Sites

Reminder: The test is a “snapshot” in time. You could test negative one day but come down with the illness the next. You still need to continue to monitor yourself for symptoms, practice social distancing, and wear a cloth face covering when you are out and about.

Newer Information

During a press conference earlier today the following information was provided by the State:

The ‘**MI Vacc to Normal**’ plan will use four vaccination-based milestones -- using data for Michiganders 16 years or older who’ve *received their first dose* -- to guide future steps required to get back to normal:

- **55% of Michiganders (4,453,304 residents), plus two weeks**
- Allows in-person work for all sectors of business.
-
- **60% of Michiganders (4,858,150 residents), plus two weeks**
- Increases indoor capacity at sports stadiums to 25%.
- Increases indoor capacity at conference centers/banquet halls/funeral homes to 25%.
- Increases capacity at exercise facilities and gyms to 50%.
- Lifts the curfew on restaurants and bars.
- **65% of Michiganders (5,262,996 residents), plus two weeks**
- Lifts all indoor % capacity limits, requiring only social distancing between parties.
- Further relaxes limits on residential social gatherings.
- **70% of Michiganders (5,667,842 residents), plus two weeks**
- Lifts the Gatherings and Face Masks Order such that MDHHS will no longer employ broad mitigation measures unless unanticipated circumstances arise, such as the spread of vaccine-resistant variants.

To date (5/3/21), Michigan has administered 7,018,442 vaccines. Currently, **50.4% of Michiganders ages 16 and older have received at least one dose**, with 38.9% percent of Michiganders ages 16 and older being fully vaccinated, moving the state closer to its goal of equitably vaccinating at least 70% of Michiganders ages 16 and older as soon as possible.
